PRAYER LETTER FOR NOVEMBER 2020

November 30, 2020

1st Chronicles 16:34 says, "*O give thanks unto the LORD; for He is good; for His goodness endureth forever.*" (KJV). November was "thanksgiving month" here at the Colinas Bible Baptist Mission and its ministries. We spent the entire month thanking the LORD for His goodness and blessings. Guatemalans really need to learn to thank God, especially because all that happened here this year thus far, including 2 major hurricanes a few weeks ago. Tragically many people lost their lives and others lost all their personal belongings. In fact, as of this writing, the flooded towns and villages in many places has not subsided. Despite this, we were actively preaching and telling everyone that the hope of the world is Christ. We got to lead many souls to the feet of Christ, besides all the help we were able to give to the hurricane survival victims: a truck load of clothing, medicine, and several hundred pounds of fresh vegetables and other non perishable items.

Our medical ministry assisted the many who came down with the flu as well as other illnesses. This ministry is mainly focused to win souls, but seems that in November we saw more of God's people than anyone else. Even so, I got to lead Mr. Victor Ayala to Christ during his visit to the Clinic. He is a 39 year man with a history of Diabetes type 1 (from birth), who came recently complaining of chest pain, headaches, etc. His blood pressure was 190/110! For 48 hours we were able to monitor that and bring it down to normal levels, thank God! However the most amazing thing was his prayer to receive the LORD as his personal Lord and Savior! Fearing death, he asked if I could pray with him; I were able to help him with that too! He got saved! Please pray for so many like Mr. Ayala who need "*the peace of God which passeth all understanding*".

Our virtual services continue each Wednesday night. Recently, Brother Ulysses Velazquez, a 68 year old man of our church brought a Bible study on "*thanking God for surviving an accident*". Mr. Velazquez was recently hit by a speeding car while attempting to cross the street. The driver of the car didn't even stop; and Mr. Velazquez was hurt badly, suffering a broken leg and a dislocated shoulder! Miraculously, he has recuperated well. His message was encouraging as so many folks here are struggling to find a reason to be grateful for life in general, and live each day as it was your last. "*Stop your complaining and give thanks to God!*" he said over and over.

Our Sunday morning services have been well attended, even if at 50% capacity. However, last Sunday the 29th we broke all the "rules" and had a wonderful Thanksgiving Sunday, with preaching by one of our Bible institute graduates, Brother Carlos Rivera, followed by an awesome turkey dinner with all its trimmings! We had we over 60 in attendance in person, with about another 25 watching on Facebook Live. Slowly things are beginning to change back to normal, and it is our prayer that next year we will be in "full swing" of things conducting services at night.

Finally we covet your prayers. Even though the LORD is meeting our financial needs in general terms, we must be honest and say that we will probably need to go back to the States soon enough to try to raise more personal support. Pray that I can do this, while Jaimie stays here to administer the Mission. Pray God will open those doors. Amen! We thank you all, and we love you all in God's love! ♥
